Two millennia ago, scrolls were sent by messengers to share the good news to budding Christian communities. In 18th century England, John Wesley did the unthinkable when he began preaching to crowds outside. And today, with the use of the internet rapidly progressing, we make yet another shift.

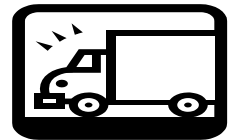

SEPTEMBER MISSION OPPORTUNITY

Our September Mission Opportunity is to support the American Cancer Society. Every dollar we provide to them goes toward eliminating cancer as a major health concern. SUMMER 2011 REPAIRS



The “Summer 2011 Repairs” projects consists of 2 items. First, we need major repair/replacement of furnace steam pipes which is estimated to cost \$11,000 and needs to be done before winter. Second, a roof section over the History room is badly leaking and is expected to cost about \$3,000 to repair. Failure to complete these repairs could result in more costly expenditures at a later time. If the congregation can contribute half the cost, or \$7,000, then the remainder can be taken from the Reserves funds. Please put “Summer 2011 Repairs” in the memo line of your check and place it in the offering or mail it to the church. We are extremely grateful for your generous support in the matter. Completion of these important items will allow us to keep the church in good repair as we head into the winter months. Thank you!
